Our school year is always punctuated by some fabulous events. Here at Mawsley, we are proud of our commitment to developing our relationship with the community and supporting the growth of our children as citizens, alongside their academic progress.

During November was our Remembrance Community day, where we opened our doors to the Mawsley Community to come together to celebrate and remember the National Act of Remembrance.

The day started with a 'Big Brew Up' coffee morning in the school hall. The 'Big Brew Up' is a fundraising initiative promoted by SSAFA – The Armed Forces Charity.
