# Friend of Mawsley School (FOMS)

Since 2017, FOMS has raised nearly £60,000 which has paid for The Cabin, playground equipment, an outdoor classroom, laptops, iPads, outdoor musical equipment, outdoor shelters for parents, library books, garden fencing and last year's Christmas Pantomime. Every year it also funds the Year 6 Leavers' Party.

At the FOMS AGM on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2021 several committee members will stand down. Without a Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary, FOMS cannot legally continue. If it closes, next year's Circus will be cancelled as would FOMS' accounts with the School Lottery and Amazon Smile. These three activities alone are due to generate about £10,000 next year. #### Year 3

The Year 3 team have been so pleased with how well the children have worked this term. We have been asking and answering lots of questions during our Geography sessions, which have been all about coasts, both in the UK and abroad. We have taken a special interest in the effects of climate change on coastal erosion, and the children have spoken passionately about the little changes we can make in our own lives to help our world to heal. We have been impressed with the level of maturity that has shone through during our conversations and lessons.

In Maths this term we have worked hard on improving our knowledge of multiplication and division and more recently, mass. The children made some excellent progress in their maths work and were able to use inverse operations to check their answers. We found reading intervals on scales a little difficult at first, but once the children worked out the trick, they were able to achieve their full potential!

In English lessons we have really enjoyed creating our own coastal towns. We have used two driver texts this term; The Mousehole Cat, and Town is by the Sea. The children really enjoyed these stories, especially the beautiful imagery in The Mousehole Cat. We have focussed on writing information texts this term and have worked up to this by creating diaries, postcards, maps and news reports all about our newly created towns.

We have also loved discovering and investigating plants in Science. We created observations to understand what plants need in order to survive, and even managed to bring them back to life when they looked a little worse for wear after our investigations! We are ending the term this week learning about music from the 1990s and have especially enjoyed creating our own Britpop bands!

Finally we would like to say a big thank you to the parents and carers of our Year 3 children. We have had a rollercoaster of a year but your support has been amazing throughout.

## Reception

We have been making the most of our last term in reception by ensuring we have lots of fun with our 'Let's Pretend' topic. Some of our favourite activities have been: Dinosaur small world; superhero dressing up; making treasure maps; cutting flowers and grass to make potions; and robot nuts and bolts pictures-to name but a few!

A real highlight was our visit from Jungle Dave, which everyone enjoyed immensely. We saw two snakes, a gecko, a male and female cockroach, a bearded dragon and a hedgehog called Terry who did a poo on the floor!! Dave was really impressed with all of our animal knowledge and our brilliant, sensible behaviour and listening skills.

We also enjoyed our first sports day experience. All the staff were so proud of how well we all joined in and that we were able to show every single Mawsley value in all the events.

We would also like to thank Miss Frost and Mr Walton for buying us some new, funky bikes and scooters. These all need pedalling in non-traditional ways, such as from a lying position. They also provided us with lots of different brushes to use in the outside area. All of these are to help with our gross motor skills to make sure we are not only brilliant at PE, but also to strengthen our core muscles, to help us write. We have had great fun trying them all out in the outside area and at playtimes.

## Year 1 and 2

Wow! We have had such a busy term learning so many new things. In our science work we have been learning about habitats, mini beasts, food chains and growing food. Lots of us were really inspired when we were asked to design an allotment and came up with some great ideas. In our Geography work we have learnt all about the weather and even became weather presenters for an afternoon! Some of us thought that this was a great career to have so we will be looking out for some familiar faces on the BBC weather in a few years' time. In our English work, we have been looking at the weather stories by Sam Usher. We used the plot of his story called 'Storm' and innovated our own stories about the weather. We were all really proud that we became story tellers.

Sports Day was a day of great excitement for us. For some of us, it was our first ever experience of it. Whilst we were a little disappointed we didn't have an audience, we all showed the Mawsley values and made some great memories with our friends. Some of us even discovered sporting talents we didn't know we had.

We have ended this term with some assessments and all of the Phase 2 staff are so proud of the children. They have shown resilience and determination to be the best they can be. Despite the challenges Covid has thrown our way, our children have really shone and made us all smile.

The children fully deserve their upcoming party, assembly and then their holiday as they have worked brilliantly this year and every member of our staff is proud of each one of them!


# **English News**
