



Discovery question:

Why is Northamptonshire a good place to live?

Key areas of learning:

The children will be looking at facilities in Northamptonshire and what makes Northamptonshire a really great place to live. Hopefully the children we have lots of prior knowledge about where they live and will help their teachers to extend their own learning by asking lots of interesting and intriguing questions.

English:

As writers, we will be learning how to write a meeting tale based on the classic novel The Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling. Children will be looking at how to describe animals using adjectives and similes and consolidating our use of Kinetic Letters and key skills such as capital letters and full stops..

Mathematics:

As mathematicians we will be learning about addition and subtraction within 20, numbers to 50, length and height. Children will address these concepts with previously learnt skills such as a part-whole, ten frame and other classroom based manipulatives.

Science:

As scientists will be learning about animals. By the end of the term children will be able to classify, compare and label animals including humans, identify the parts of the body that are associated with a sense and use a Venn diagram to group animals based on what food they eat.

Curriculum enrichment:

In Brainboost this term children will be jetting off to lots of different countries and having the opportunities to learn about different cultures.

Spiritual, Moral, Social & Cultural (SMSC):

In PSHE children will be learning about anatomical names for their private parts. We will also have a focus this term on our health and wellbeing and ways we can look after ourselves and our friends.

How can you help at home?

Please encourage your children to read daily.

To secure the previous terms knowledge it would be helpful for you to continue counting forwards AND backwards to 100 in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's and practise recording the written form for numbers to 100.
